


Warm lamp. bioplastic, knitting, metal.


This lamp looks like a scalp with something soft, warm and bright on eyes, like you want to treat those eyes.



"Will -o'-the-wisp" Lamp. Bioplastic, metal.


Will-o'-the-wisp metaphorically refers to a hope. This is an ephemeral object that points the way or leads away from it.

This phenomenon is known in myths and legends of European culture. Wandering lights in nature, caused by the oxidation of natural gases in forests and swamps.


Small lights move with the wind. They chase the observer who tries to escape from them, and they themselves run away from the one who tries to approach them

So, I take this form because it reflects my feelings. These ephemeral objects embody uncertainty, beauty and hope.












Abstraction 1. About home Acrylic, paper


From above, a person flying on a creature that looks like a large bird.
